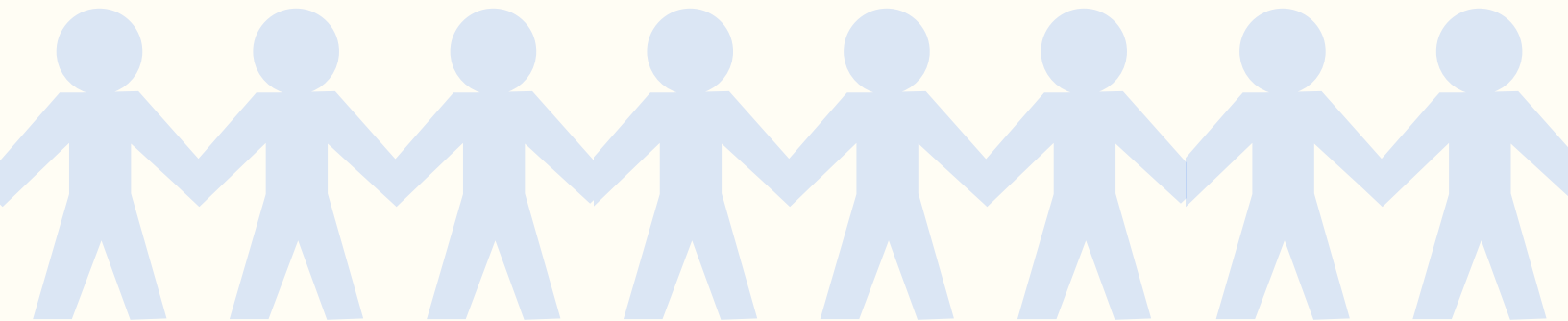
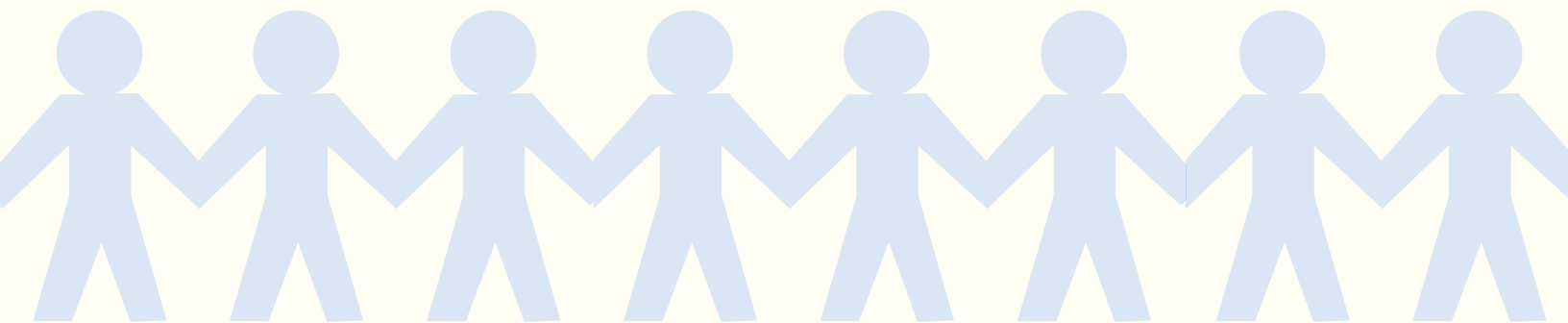

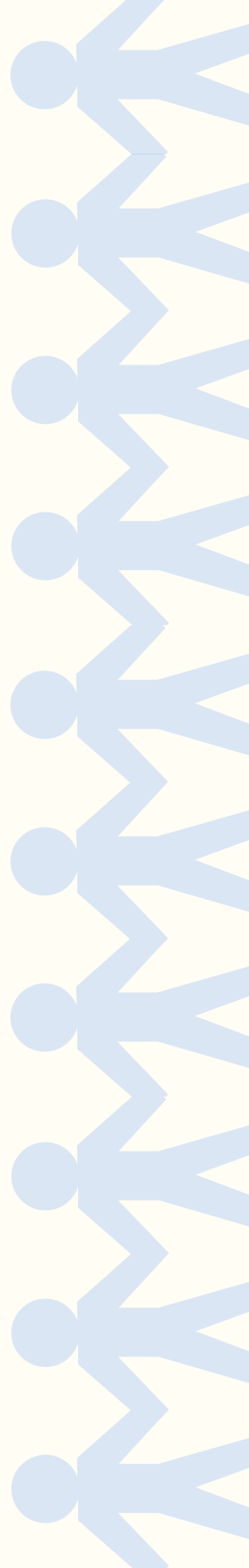

Village Volunteerism

Over the past year, Village Northwest Unlimited clients have come together to create lasting change through volunteerism. Logging an impressive 1,305 hours, 61 individuals have contributed their time and energy to various service opportunities. With 18 different choices for service, our clients' efforts are making a meaningful impact.

Our weekly "Volunteering All Around" program brings service to new locations including the Sheldon Food Bank, Unity Meal, Kaden's Klostet, and Sheldon East Elementary School every Monday. This opportunity stands out as a key initiative in connecting Village clients with service opportunities that directly benefit local organizations and communities.

As part of this weekly curriculum, client volunteers dedicate their Mondays to helping a different cause, bringing support to a variety of locations. This flexibility and outreach has become a cornerstone of our community service efforts. This program option doesn't just offer support—it builds lasting connections that strengthen our community.

By rotating through a range of organizations each week, "Volunteering All Around" ensures that no corner of the community goes unnoticed. Whether it's helping at the Sheldon Food Bank, assisting with the Unity Meal, pitching in at East Elementary, or sorting at Kaden's Klostet, the Village brings vital hands-on support where it's needed most. This dynamic piece of our program allows Village clients to explore different ways to give back.

For local organizations, the impact is profound. With fresh volunteers arriving each Monday, they receive ongoing, consistent help that keeps their programs running smoothly. It's not just about the tasks being completed—it's about building relationships and a culture of giving that continues throughout the community.

In essence, "Volunteering All Around" strengthens the bonds between local organizations and community members, creating a network of support that uplifts everyone involved. Through this initiative, we can create a more compassionate and connected community together.

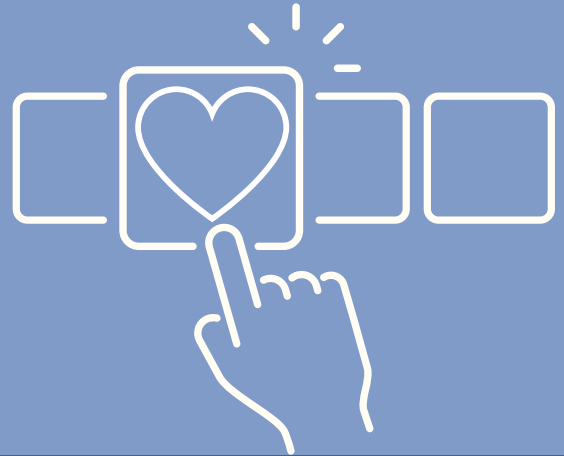

Jaxon W: A Resident Story

Together the residents, guardians, parents, and staff of VNU grow as they develop relationships built on a commitment to provide purpose, privacy, and dignity while seeking opportunities and choices to build successful lives. An example of this growth can be seen in the success that Jaxon has experienced since joining the Village family.

Jaxon's connection to the Village began in February of his senior year of high school when he began participating in the day programming offered through the Summit. He and his mother Jade, were looking for opportunities that would start to prepare Jaxon for life after high school. They felt the opportunities for community involvement and life skills training would help Jaxon transition from a high school student to adulthood. They saw this adjustment as being similar to the transition other students experience as they graduate high school and join the military, the workforce, or attend college.

In June, Jaxon and his family celebrated his graduation from high school and moved him into the newly remodeled home at 708 Union. Jaxon attends programming at the Summit, is exploring possible employment opportunities, and is building relationships with his roommates, other consumers, and Village staff members.

Jade has been thinking of Jaxon's future since he was a young child. "Of course, I always thought Jaxon would live with me forever. Any mom of a young child cannot bear the thought of them leaving the home. I remember what an emotional wreck I was when I sent my twins to college. The thought of Jaxon leaving home and trusting others to take care of him was unimaginable."





"Of course, as the seasons of life change, I knew what was best for Jaxon and our family was for him to live with peers of a similar ability and be as independent as possible." After looking at other agencies and programs, Jade chose to explore the opportunities at Village Northwest Unlimited due to the organization's proximity to their home and the reputation of the program.

Their initial visit to VNU lasted over three hours. "I remember leaving that day feeling excited and hopeful. I was in awe of all the offerings of the program and staff involvement. It was clear to me that this program would meet Jaxon's needs and provide an opportunity to have a fulfilled, successful future." He is washing his own clothes, keeping his room clean, and helping with meal prep. Staff have helped Jaxon get a new ID with his new address on it and have assisted him in setting up a checking account. Jaxon is participating in activities and developing relationships with his roommates. "As a mom, my heart is content that he is where he should be, and I have full faith in those guiding him and providing the support he needs to lead a purposeful life", states Jade.



When Jade is asked about the goals she hopes Jaxon achieves while at VNU, Jade stated, "I just want Jaxon to be happy, whatever that may look like for him. I hope that he forms positive relationships with his peers and that he feels like his life is fulfilled through the activities he participates in and the work he may do in the future. He has worked very hard to get where he is today. I look forward to all the opportunities that VNU offers Jaxon. He has a bright future."



Jade is very satisfied with the decision she and Jaxon made to partner with VNU. She feels that the staff members want nothing more than to see Jaxon be successful. Everyone is united together in their desire and commitment to help Jaxon reach the full potential of his bright future. According to Jade, "VNU is one of a kind. Top notch! I would not be satisfied with Jaxon being anywhere else. He deserves the best."

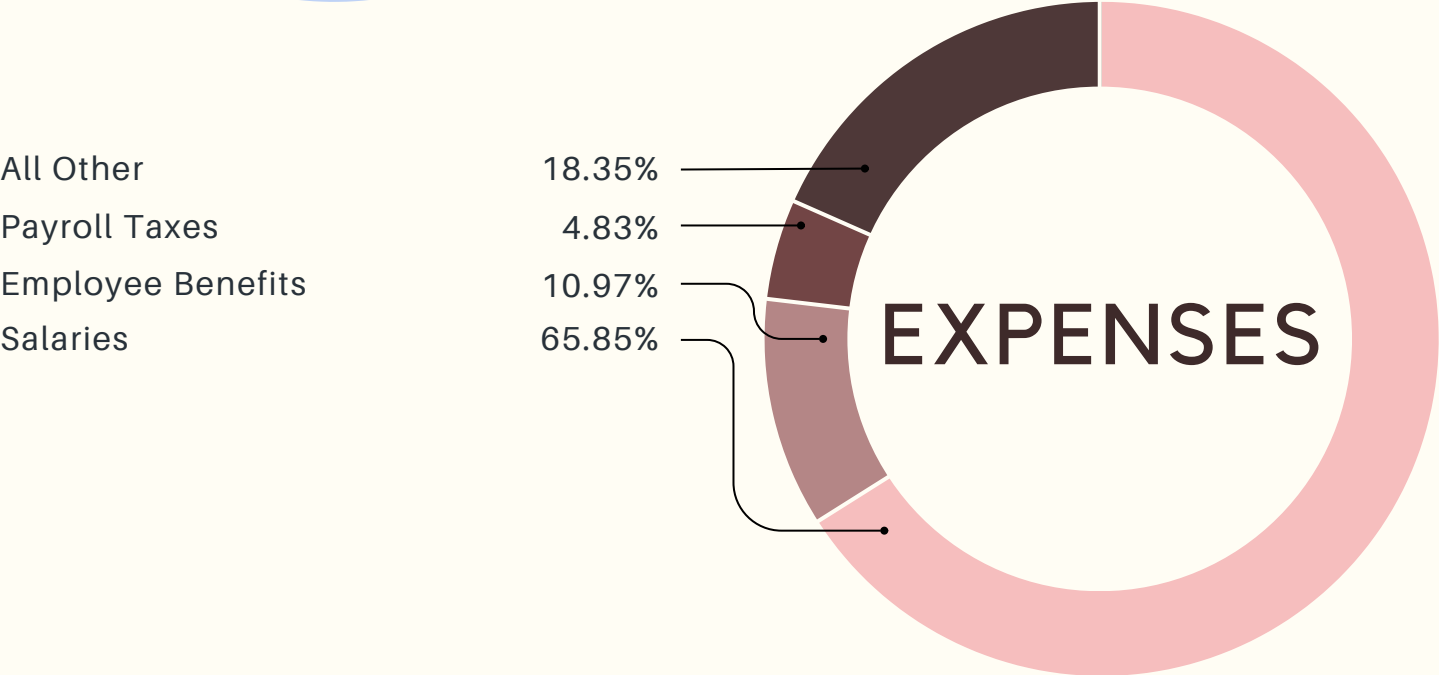
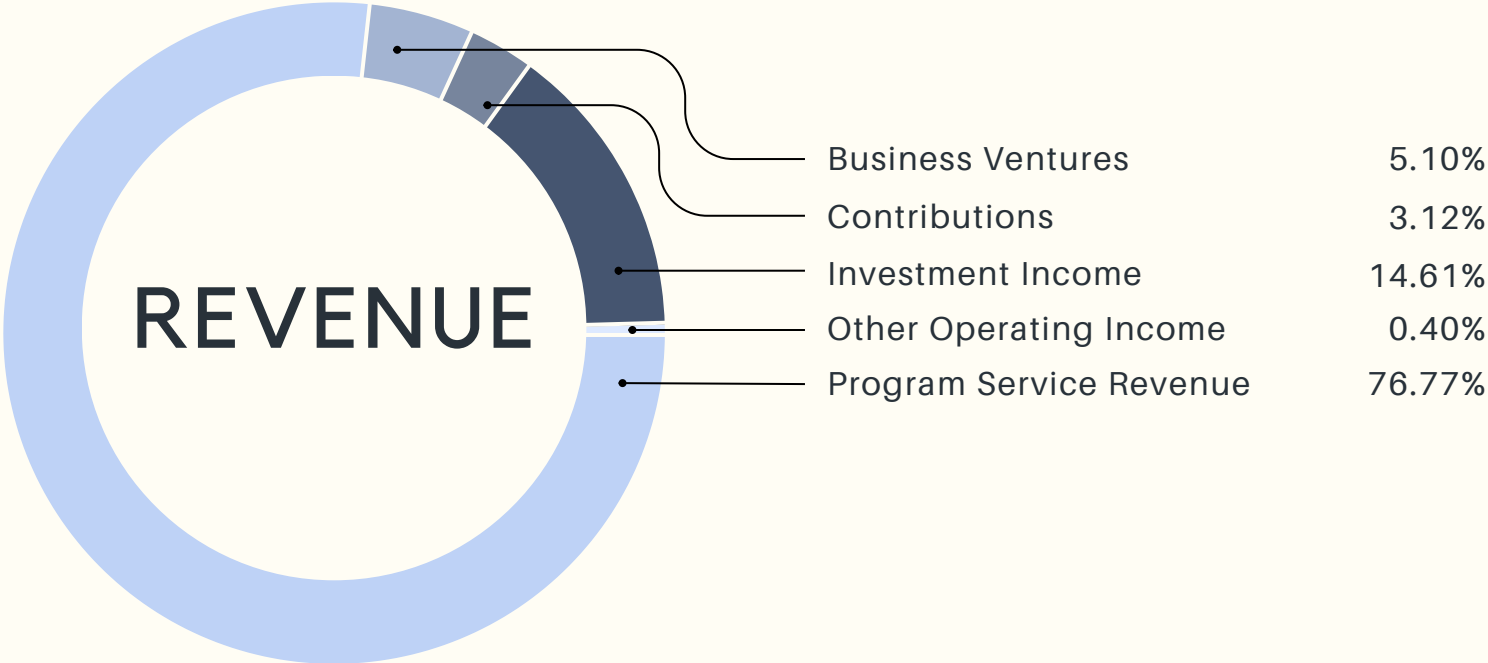

Sanford Sheldon Electrical Box Mural

Creativity comes alive when people collaborate, and our recent community art initiative is a testament to that. This summer, we set out to transform an electrical box at Sheldon Sanford into a beautiful mural. But we didn't do it alone our consumers, staff, and the Sanford personnel all came together to make this vision a reality.

While our mural group started the cleaning and priming with an all-day pop-up class in May, this project started long before. Maggie Gisch, one of our Summit staff members and Mural lead, started conceptualizing ideas with Sanford Health for the 360-square-foot mural starting earlier this year. In June and July, our mural painters showed up in full force. Village clients and staff members brought their creative energy to the mural, helping Gisch to execute her original vision - a mural that depicted a nature scene but one that incorporated the four seasons of winter, spring, summer and fall. As a person walks around the mural, they will see the progression of the four seasons.

Despite the challenges—rainy days and limited time—our mural painters, 11 individuals served by the Village, and 4 staff members, excitedly came together ready to contribute. The mural was officially completed at the beginning of August. “Timing wise it took many months of planning, but the actual painting was probably 80 - 100 hours of work,” stated Gisch.

The idea for the Sanford mural did not come from nowhere, this is the second electrical box mural designed and painted by Gisch and Summit clients. The first of these electrical box murals was actually in front of our very own Summit building. “A few years back I had asked Mag Vander Wilt, Community Program Director, about designing a class on painting murals.

Both Mag and I have seen murals on electrical boxes and thought we could start with the one in front of the Summit.” At the time, Gisch had no idea the community support this would spark.

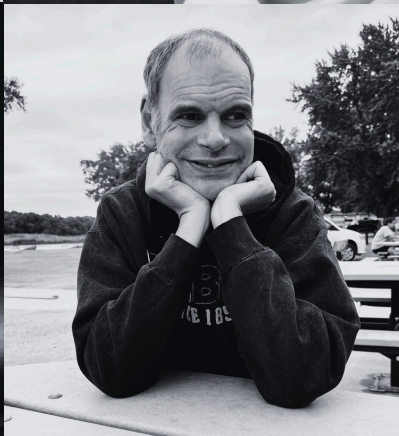
After seeing the finished mural at the Summit, Rick Nordahl, the CEO at Sanford Sheldon, approached the Village about coming together to create a mural on the electrical box at Sanford Sheldon. Nordahl loved the mural at the Summit and wanted VNU to bring a new and vibrant life to the electrical box at Sanford Sheldon.

This community art initiative is something the Village hopes garners continued support. Not only does this project bring color and creativity to the community but it has also created an amazing sense of pride in our clients that assisted with the project. If you look closely, you will see the signatures of each of the clients that helped paint the mural.

“I loved seeing our clients enjoy making art for the community and the interactions the consumers had with the people who passed by. So many people stopped by to talk with us about what we were doing, who we were, and how they liked our work. Our consumers were able to take pride in their work, which wasn't just for themselves but also for the community” commented Gisch.

Gisch is looking forward to future mural projects throughout the community. “I love to paint! I love art! But, most importantly, I love to see our consumers participating in the community” said Gisch. Together, we created something beautiful and we are so excited to see what our Summit friends use their talents to create next.

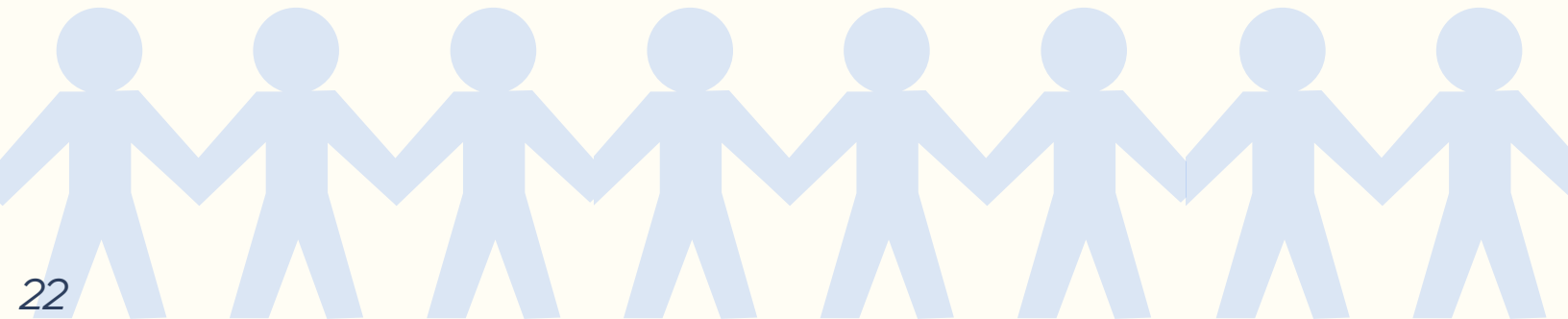

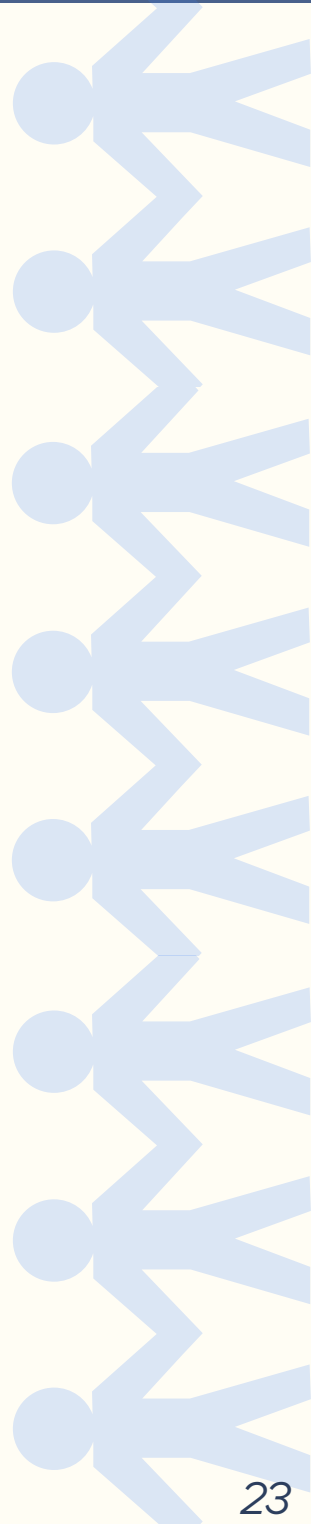
