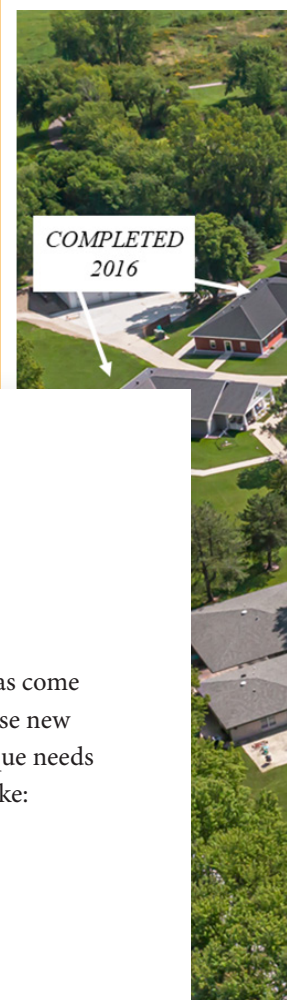

A Journey to

BETTER SERVE OUR RESIDENTS

In 1975 when the Village was founded people with disabilities were being served in institutions with settings where there would be sometimes over 20 people in a large room with bunk beds. There was very little privacy and very little dignity for these people.

Advocates and families recognized this and places like the Village began to transition people out of these institutions and provide them with homes that provided smaller settings, private bedrooms and programs that gave people dignity and purpose.

As providers like the Village continued to evolve employment opportunities were introduced. People could have a job providing valuable assistance to companies and giving people with disabilities a chance to have purpose through going to work and dignity by earning a paycheck. Programs developed to allow people to seek competitive employment in the community.

In the past 7 years VNU has been on a journey to redefine the homes on our campus in which our residents live. VNU has built six new ICF-ID homes on our campus and remodeled another home to better serve the needs of our residents.

In 1975 when our ICF-ID homes were built, they were state of the art for the time. However, times change and needs change. Our residents have changed in the past 47 years in their care needs and so we have had to redesign and rethink what our homes require in order to meet the care needs of the population we are serving now and for the next 47 years.

Toward that end we have staff from multiple areas come together to design the homes we have built. These new homes are specifically designed to meet the unique needs of people with disabilities and include features like:

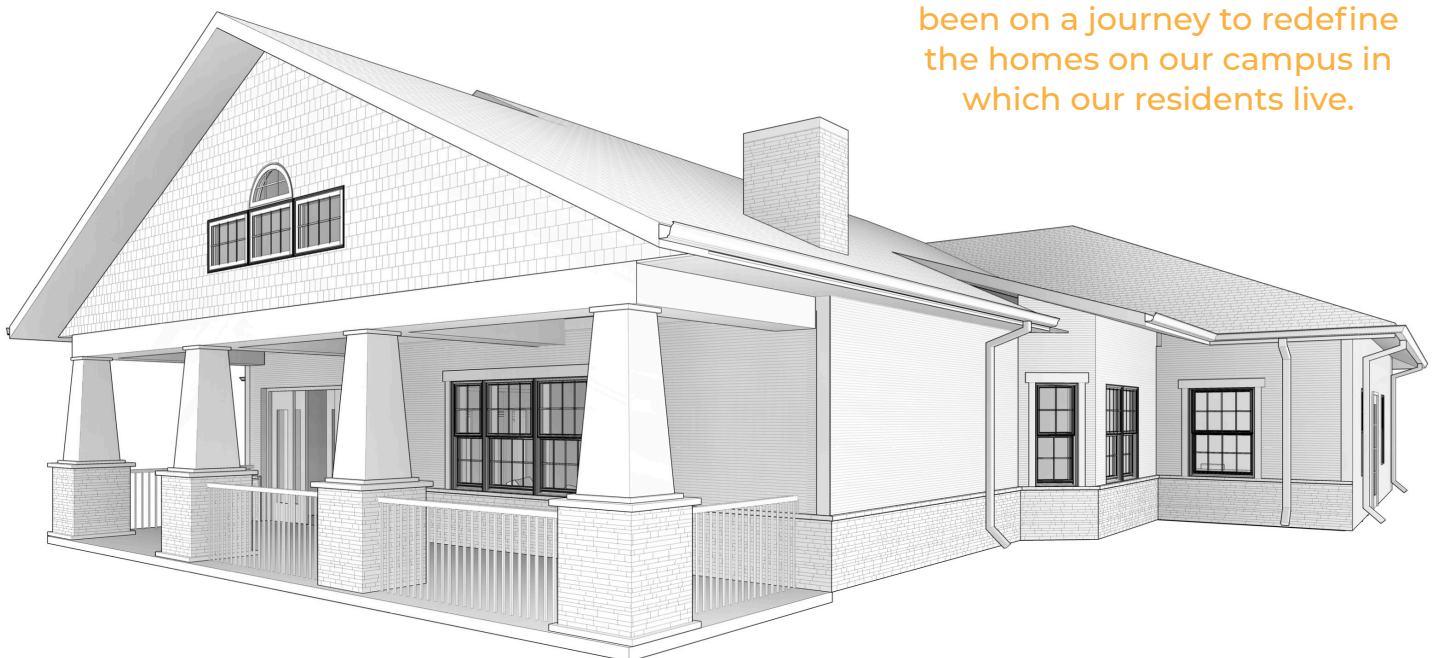
- Zero grade entrances
- Smaller settings
- Patio space for outdoor enjoyment
- Open concept design for easy movement
- Wide and expansive kitchens
- Double wide hallways for wheelchairs
- Private half baths in the rooms
- Lift systems to move people safely
- Abundant natural lighting
- Accessible showers and whirlpool tubs
- Warm, family like environments
- Storm shelters

One thing is certain the journey for the Village will always been changing and ever evolving to meet the needs of the people we serve. It is our mission to provide Purpose, Privacy and Dignity and that means constantly striving to provide an environment that bring that mission to life for the people we serve.

Our new and remodeled homes are a vast improvement from the days of institutional care and from 47 years ago and we know there will be future improvements. We recognize it is part of the journey of the Village to better serve our residents.

A Journey

46 YEARS IN THE MAKING

Raymond Krumm, also known as Keith, took a chance in 1976 by moving to Village Northwest Unlimited. The Village was a brand-new facility, which had just opened its doors and was beginning to admit residents. Keith was one of the first group of residents at VNU and now 46 years later Keith could not be more proud to continue to call Village Northwest Unlimited his home.

Keith has two sisters who reside in South Dakota and Arizona, but Keith has expanded his “family” over his many years at VNU. Keith’s family has grown as he has developed new relationships with Village staff and residents as he has moved across the continuum of Village housing options. Keith has lived on the Village campus; he has lived in East Oak Apartments and currently lives in one of VNU’s community group homes. No matter where Keith has lived his infectious personality and love of life has allowed him to form deep and meaningful relationships with his housemates and VNU staff.

If there is one thing Keith is known for it is his enthusiasm to participate and that includes athletics through VNU’s Special Olympics program. You name a sport and Keith has participated in it. Keith has been involved in ice skating, bowling, soccer, track and field, volleyball, basketball skills and basketball. Keith had the honor of being named the Iowa Special Olympic Athlete of the Year in 2012. Keith’s Special Olympic coaches, Sara Wolthuizen and Deb Middle, expressed how well he gets along with others and how he loves to try new things. Sara Wolthuizen recalls Keith playing in scrimmage at halftime of a Sheldon High school basketball game. “Keith is a crowd favorite. He would run down the side of the court after making a basket and he’s giving out high fives to the people in the stands and the crowd is going wild...I think he enjoyed the people more than he did the game itself! After the game kids are coming up to him asking him to autograph their programs. People love Keith and Keith loves people”.

The manager of the home Keith lives in, Nicole Freeman, says, “He is the first to wake up and say good morning to you, but he is also the last one to say goodnight. No matter what he does, he is always smiling and wanting to help. He is one of the most genuine people I know”. Keith is known around VNU for his goofy personality and fun spirit. “Everyone comes before him; he is a team player and loves to volunteer. Nicole points out that Keith even approaches the various custodial jobs he has done over the years with a zeal for helping out. Nicole is proud of how Village Northwest Unlimited has given Keith so many opportunities in his journey of life. Keith has been out and about around the community for many years, which has helped him become very comfortable around society. “Keith has grown his social skills; he has been able to make himself known through conversation with people.” Keith is not only great out in the community but he is a great housemate. Having turned 73 on August 18, 2022, Keith has lived with peers of various ages. Freeman said, “He is such a great peer. When he meets someone new, there is no age gap. Keith always just goes up and talks to the new person he is meeting.”

No matter where Keith has lived his infectious personality and love of life has allowed him to form deep and meaningful relationships with his housemates and VNU staff.

The young feeling 73-year-old takes any chance he has to be out in the community. Age is only a number to Keith and you can often find him working, attending or playing sports, or just being active outside. He is always saying hi to everyone and is very welcoming to everyone he meets with a genuine smile.

Keith would tell you that the chance he took 46 years ago has turned into the greatest journey he could have ever imagined and he is thankful for all his staff who have provided opportunities for him to live his best life at VNU.

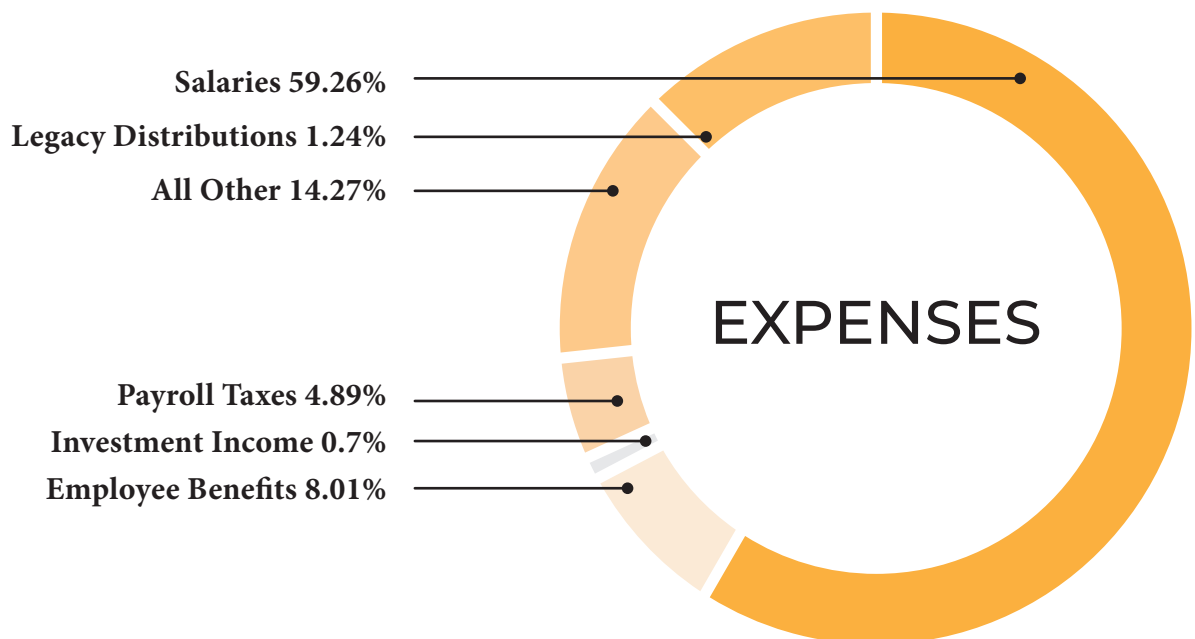
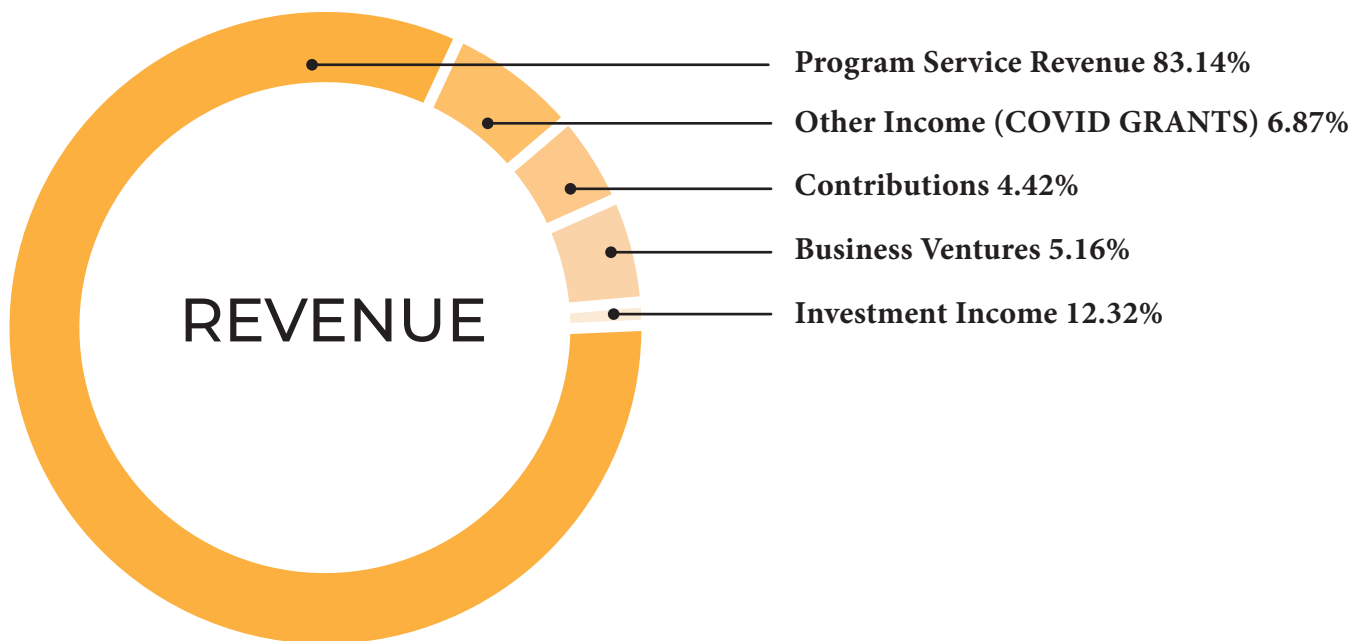

A Day in the Life

THE DAILY JOURNALS OF A CAMPUS RESIDENT

There are no normal days at VNU. Every day has its own challenges, success stories, fun and excitement. For a resident in the ICF/ID program, who lives on campus a typical day starts with a wake-up call from staff. Like many people, the day begins with getting dressed, having breakfast, brushing teeth, possibly showering or bathing although sometimes that comes later in the day.

Many people take medications for various ailments and residents at VNU are no different. At VNU, a Medication Administration Aide (Med Aide) assists people with taking their medications. The Med Aide ensures medications are taken correctly and in the right dosage and at the right time. A Med Aide has to meet certain training requirements in order to pass medications. VNU has 51 staff who are registered Med Aides.

During a resident's day, they have the opportunity to experience and participate in many fun activities, which we call, Day Program. On a quarterly basis residents choose from a menu of activities, programs and classes being offered. Each person's schedule is different and personalized to his or her likes and needs.

Day Program has been very busy this summer. Aside from routine outings to the library, going out for coffee or church tours, we have added day trips to resident's schedules that they can sign up for. So far, the groups have gone to the Washington Pavilion in Sioux Falls, The Vander Haag Truck Museum in Sanborn, the Train Museum and the River Front Park in Sioux City. Our Music and Movement group has gone to the zoo in Sioux Falls and are

planning a trip to the Music Museum in Vermillion and the Dam in Yankton. Our church tour group went to the Grotto earlier in the summer. A highlight for one group was going to a Minnesota Twins baseball game. Throughout the 2022 summer, classes took day trips to the Sioux Falls zoo, numerous greenhouses, local farms and museums.

Those residents who need therapy services have those activities scheduled during their day. VNU offers a wide array of therapy services including physical therapy, speech therapy and occupational therapy. These therapy programs are overseen by certified therapists through an arrangement VNU has with Sanford Sheldon.

During meal times, each resident has their meal in their own home. All of the meals are prepared in each individual house by the residential staff. Menus for each home are prepared ahead of time by VNU's registered dietician, Sheila Storbakken. Each resident has their own menu for every meal depending on their special dietary needs. For some, liquids need to be used to thicken food and for others their meals need to be apportioned into manageable bites to prevent choking.

In the evenings, you will often find residents sitting on their porch enjoying the weather and socializing. On nice summer nights, the VNU circle is busy with staff and residents on walks, riding bikes or enjoying golf cart rides. All of the homes on campus have smart televisions so movies or television shows can be enjoyed as residents relax from their busy day.

Senior Internship Turns into **LIFE LONG JOURNEY**

Judy Dykstra, an Ocheyedan, IA native has been employed at Village Northwest Unlimited for the last 45 years. Judy has lived in Sanborn, IA for the last 43 years and has commuted to work at the Village.

Judy was first employed at the Village to complete an internship for her senior year of college. At 22 years-old, Judy did not think her senior year internship would turn into 45 years of employment at VNU. After graduating, Judy began working full-time for the Village. She has done direct care along with her Monday through Friday job of completing various reports from financial to staffing and also working with social security.

Judy not only loved her job for the flexible schedule and staying close to home, but also the Christian based company and seeing it as more of a calling. "When you work at Village Northwest Unlimited, you do not join for the money, you join because it is a calling," Judy explained. She is also hopeful that VNU is able to gain additional hard-working and caring employees to the team we already have. Judy talked about the life-changing experience that

staff would have if they were called to work at the Village. Judy went into further detail saying, "If you give VNU your all, you will be blessed."

Along with her "normal" job at the Village, Judy also helped with the Village Singers for 35 years. The Village Singers was a program the staff and residents participated in. She said, "Watching the residents sing was so special, it gave them such purpose and pride." The Village Singers would travel around to various churches and nursing homes to perform. Looking back on the 35 years, Judy recalled performing at Fantasia, her favorite memory of the Village Singers. "Everything was so festive and fun. Everyone would dress up in their Christmas sweaters and Fantasia was decorated. It was just a great event to always participate in."

The Village Singers has not been Judy's only favorite memory of the Village. When Covid-19 arose, she was able to help out at the Village Treasure Chest. Judy was happy to be able to help out when volunteers were unable to work during the pandemic, Judy stepped up and was able to help out to keep the Treasure Chest open.



Over Judy's 45 years of employment, Village Northwest Unlimited changed. Judy started when only two houses were on campus. She has been able to witness the expansion of not only houses, but program curriculum as well. "It has been amazing to see the Village be able to expand but still meet each residents' individual needs," Judy said. Judy also talked about the improvements to the new houses resulting in bigger rooms for residents and more individualized care.
